Funding Options Explained

TWO YEAR FUNDING

From April 2024, eligible 2-year-olds of working families will be entitled to up to 15 hours funded Childcare. This will increase to 30 hours from September 2025. For more information and to apply visit <u>www.childcarechoices.gov.uk.</u>

TWO YEAR FUNDING (PLAY 2 LEARN OR FREE FOR 2)

Your 2-year-old may be eligible for two year funding if you have a household income of under £15,400, or are in receipt of any of the following benefits: income support, job seekers allowance, working tax or child tax credits. You can also be eligible if your child: has an EHCP, is a looked after child, is claiming Disability Living Allowance.

15 HOURS GOVERNMENT FUNDING

All 3 and 4-year-olds in England can get 570 hours of free early education or childcare per year, usually taken as 15 hours a week for up to 38 weeks of the year.

30 HOURS GOVERNMENT FUNDING

Some 3 and 4-year-olds will be able to get 30 hours funded childcare or education. The additional 15 hours of funded childcare is available for families where: both parents are working (or the sole parent is working in a lone-parent family), each parent earns at least the equivalent of 16 hours a week at the national minimum or living wage and less than £100,000 a year.

Whether your child is 2 or 3 their funding will start at the beginning of the term following their birthday. Your 2-year-old can only access funding if they meet the set criteria.
